

Part-Time Certified Peer Specialist

The Certified Peer Specialist (CPS) performs a range of tasks through individual and group encounters to assist consumers of behavioral health services in regaining control over their own lives and over their own recovery process. The CPS will role model competency in recovery and ongoing coping skills, serve as a consumer advocate, provide information and peer support in their communities. The CPS also provides essential expertise and consultation to other team members in promoting a recovery-oriented culture and practice of service provision and in understanding the consumers' perspective and subjective experience.

Must have lived mental health experience. Must have received Peer Specialist Certification upon graduation of the Certified Peer Specialist Training. In addition, must have a high school diploma or general equivalence degree (GED) and within the last 3 years has maintained at least 12 months of successful full or part time paid or voluntary work experience, or obtained at least 24 credit hours of post-secondary education. Must have a current driver's license and no auto accidents within the last 2 years, no DUI in 5 years. Prefer candidates with previous CPS experience.

At PSAN employment is contingent upon completion of a pre-employment drug screen and background check.
